
Wine Tasting event at the Jewish Community Center

The program was opened by Dr. Robert Forbes, President of the Jewish Historical Society, who welcomed all the guests. Then he introduced the Mayor of New Haven, the Honorable Toni Harp. Mayor Harp brought

greetings from the City of New Haven and spoke about the importance of the Jewish Community to the city.

This was followed with entertainment by the CT Z'mirah Chorale and the Pratt & Whitney Chorus conducted by Kevin Mack accompanied by pianist Frank Viola.

After the entertainment, Rabbi Murray Levine gave a motzi and the guests enjoyed a Kosher Buffet Dinner by Abel Caterers.

After dinner, the program continued with Dr. Norman Ravski introducing Judy Alperin, who then spoke briefly.

Next Mark Sklarz introduced Lisa Stanger who also spoke.

Both presenters cited the many accomplishments of Judy and Lisa. However, the basic theme of all four speakers was the necessity of having a New Haven Jewish Historical Society so that the New Haven Jewish community knows their history and remembers the past.



All four speakers also spoke of the importance of the Foundation and Federation as we move into the future. Both honorees received a gift of an engraved pewter cup as a souvenir of the event.

President Rob Forbes called for a vote from the general membership to approve the new Jewish Historical Society by-laws and also to approve the new slate of directors for 2018-2019.

Concluding remarks were given by President Forbes and he thanked all for attending.


